



Curriculum at Pickhurst Academy

P4C aims to encourage children to think critically, respectfully, creatively and collaboratively. The children build a "community of enquiry" where they create and enquire into their own questions.

The questions raised come from a stimulus that is shared with the children. The stimulus can take the form of objects, artefacts, pictures, photographs and videos. The children can even bring in their own stimulus to share with the class. Each half-term, there is a different focus for enquiry, which are all founded from the core British Values.
