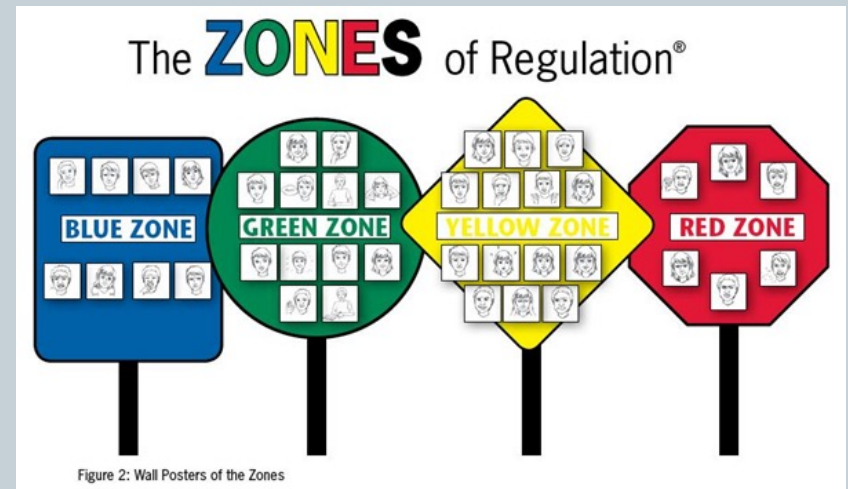

# Expectations - uniform

Children with stud earrings should cover them with micropore tape before a P.E. lesson.

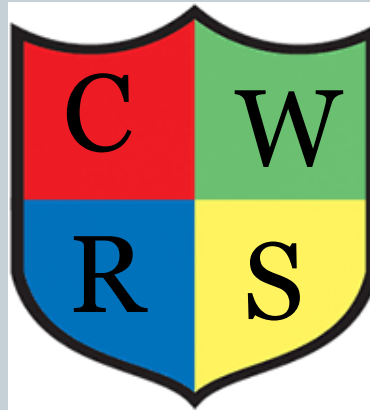
Long hair should be tied back. Clothing with commercial designer logos is not permitted.
